GHS GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- 4.0 credits of English
- 3.0 credits of Math (Algebra/Geometry/Elective)
 3.0 credits of Science (Biology/Physical/ Chem. or Elective)
- □ 3.5 credits of Social Studies (World/US Hist./US 45/Economics)
- 1.5 credits of Physical Education
- □ 0.5 credit of Health
- 7.5 credits of Electives

GHS Graduation Requirements meets 4-Year college admissions; check for unique campus requirements.

Cum Laude

- Qualifications for Cum Laude status at GHS
 - Earn at least 26 credits.
 - Earn a 3.8 GPA or higher
 - **Cum Laude**: 3.8 GPA with successful completion of at least 1 Advanced Placement course.
 - **Magna Cum Laude**: 4.0 GPA with successful completion of at least 3 Advanced Placement courses.
 - **Summa Cum Laude**: 4.2 GPA or higher with successful completion of at least 5 Advanced Placement courses.
 - No academic integrity violations.
 - Perform a minimum of 60 community service/volunteer hours.
 - Participate in a co-curricular for a minimum of 3 years during high school.

Your Student's High School Transcript

- Legal Document.
- Individual meetings throughout high school focuses on academics and strengthening the transcript.
- Transcript shows: Cumulative GPA, Class Rank and lists courses with semester grades.
- This is required with college applications and/or scholarships.

Course Selection for Junior Year

- English- English 11 or Elective
- Social Studies-Economics and US History 45
- Math- Algebra 2 or above
- Science-Chemistry or Elective
- Physical Ed-o.5 credit EITHER junior or senior year
- Elective credits

Pre-ACT, ACT, AP

Pre-ACT: Sept 12 and April 9th

ACT: Junior Year-Why?

AP (Advanced Placement): Optional in May each year

- □ Take the ACT during second semester.
- Keep record of all activities for applications.
- Start looking at and visiting colleges.
- Research grade and class requirements.
- Begin determining a specific occupation.

Building Blocks for the Future


Senior Year

- Maintain good grades.
- Retake the ACT (Sept./Oct) if you think you can improve your score.
- Apply to colleges before November holidays.
- Apply for scholarships.
- Apply for financial aid.
- Finalize your plan by May 1



Checklist for Parents

- Continue to encourage your student to take challenging high school courses. (strengthen transcript)
- ✓ Provide a consistent and distraction free study setting in the home.
- Explore careers, colleges, and life after high school with your student.
