Measles FAQ

Measles! What is it?

Measles is a viral infection of the respiratory tract. Symptoms start with a fever, runny nose, cough, red eyes and sore throat, followed by a rash that spreads over the body.

How is measles transmitted?

Measles is one of the most contagious of all infectious diseases. The virus is transmitted by direct contact with infectious droplets or by airborne spread when an infected person breathes, coughs or sneezes.

How do I know if I am immune?

Evidence of immunity against measles includes at least **one** of the following: written documentation of adequate vaccination, laboratory evidence of immunity, laboratory confirmation of measles, or birth in the United States before 1957.

People living in Wisconsin can look up their records on the Wisconsin Immunization Registry www.dhs.wisconsin.gov/immunization/wir.htm.

What can be done at the Workplace Clinic?

- Help determine if you are immune and/or if you should get vaccinated
- Provide the measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccination
- If there is uncertainty of your immunity, the provider can order a measles titer blood test to check if you are immune
- Discuss the risks and how to protect yourself if you are not immune
