## **EARN WHILE YOU LEARN**

As the skilled labor shortage continues, tradespeople are in high demand — and many earn well beyond the wages of college graduates. Through union registered apprenticeship, students can begin a rewarding career in the construction trades without taking on college debt. Through industry investment, apprentices are paid to receive hands-on and classroom training to complete their “trades degree”.

## **HOW APPRENTICESHIP WORKS**

Union apprenticeship programs are jointly managed by labor and management, offering standardized, U.S. Department of Labor-approved training led by certified instructors in state-of-the-art facilities funded by unions and contractors. Each trade’s apprenticeship process has a separate application, program requirements and training and wage scale.

Union Registered Apprentices receive:

- On-the-job training alongside experienced journeyworkers
- Classroom instruction related to their trade
- Progressive wage increases as skills and experience grow
  - Most apprentices start at about 50% of a journeyworker’s wage, with regular raises as they meet milestones throughout the program. Apprentices also earn benefits such as health insurance and retirement contributions.

\*Non-union programs vary by employer and often lack consistent standards, oversight, safety requirements and access to advanced training resources.

## **WHO IS A GOOD FIT FOR A CAREER IN CONSTRUCTION?**

A student who’s a good fit for a career in construction typically enjoys hands-on, active work and seeing tangible results from their efforts. They’re often problem-solvers, team players, and detail-oriented learners who prefer learning by doing rather than sitting in a classroom all day.

Success in the skilled trades also takes persistence, professionalism, and a strong work ethic. Union apprenticeship programs are competitive, but they offer incredible rewards including excellent pay, premium healthcare insurance, retirement benefits (including a pension), and transferable skills that open doors across the country.

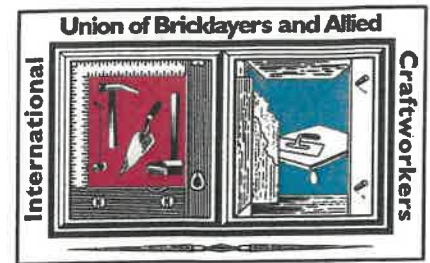

Bricklayers work with clay and concrete blocks, tiles, stone and other similar materials to build or repair walls, arches, patios, chimneys and other structures.

## Step 1: Complete the Application

You will need to upload:

- High School Diploma or Transcripts
- Valid Driver's License
- Passing Accuplacer or ACT Test Scores
  - READING: Next Generation Accu. Minimum Score of 240 / ACT Score 14
  - ARITHMETIC: Next Generation Accu. Minimum Score of 220 / ACT Score 15

\*You will not be considered a qualified applicant until all documents are submitted.

## Step 2: Become a Qualified Applicant

Once all required documents are submitted and verified, your application status will change to Qualified Applicant. This means you're now eligible to be selected for our Pre-Job Training Program.

## Step 3: Pre-Job Training Program

Our Pre-Job Training Program is a free, hands-on opportunity designed to simulate real worksite conditions and prepare you for the masonry industry.

- Only Offered twice per year — Spring and Summer
- Monday-Friday, 6:50 AM to 3:30 PM
- 4 to 6 weeks of in-person training
- No compensation during the program (unpaid), but extremely valuable experience
- Focused on basic masonry skills, safety, tools, and contractor expectations

\*This program is competitive and space is limited. If we receive more qualified applicants than the program can accommodate, interviews will be held to determine final selection.

During the training, contractors will visit and connect with participants, offering opportunities for networking and potential employment. While employment is not guaranteed, this program often serves as a stepping stone to a long-term career.

## **Step 1: Complete the Testing Process**

# OPERATING ENGINEERS LOCAL 139



Operating engineers operate and repair all types of heavy equipment, including cranes, bulldozers, front-end loaders, rollers, backhoes, graders, dredges, hoists, drills, pumps and compressors. These tradespeople work in industries such as highway and building construction, mining, tunnels, landscaping, power plants, refineries, railroads, quarries, plants that produce rock, sand and gravel, logging, and utility work like gas, water and sewer excavation.

# PLUMBERS



Plumbers install drain, waste and vent systems, water supply systems, gas systems, backflow protection devices, fixtures and appliances. This trade involves cutting, threading, fit pipes, valves, and caulking, pipe fitting, soldering, brazing and install copper and PVC piping and setting fixtures. Plumbers work in all types of weather conditions, both indoors and outside, in high places and confined spaces.

## **Step 4: Letter of Introduction**

Upon completion of steps 1-3, the Apprenticeship Office will invite you to a scheduled session to receive your Letter of Introduction. This will qualify you to apply to plumbing companies. After receiving your Letter of Introduction (L.O.I.), you'll be eligible for exclusive access to free pre-apprenticeship courses to prepare you for success. Additionally, you'll be included in Plumbers 75's outreach to contractors highlighting apprenticeship candidates that have met program prerequisites.

## **Step 5: Selection**

You are competing against other entry-level applicants to demonstrate your apprenticeship readiness. If you prove to your contractor you are a good fit for an apprenticeship, they will sponsor you into the apprenticeship program.

Sprinkler Fitters are pipefitting specialists in fire protection. They install, repair, and maintain all types of fixed extinguishing systems. While most of this work deals directly with automatic sprinkler systems, they also have the skills necessary to install and service a wide variety of other fire protection equipment such as standpipes, CO2 systems, foam systems, and dry chemical systems.

## **Step 4: Letter of Introduction**

Once the Accuplacer has been passed, the applicant will be notified by mail to appear before the Milwaukee Area Sprinkler Fitting Joint Apprenticeship Committee for an interview. Their interview score is combined with their test scores and this total score determines where the applicant is placed on the waiting list. As contractors submit requests for apprentices, applicants are pulled from the top of the list.

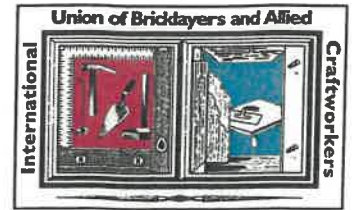

# TILESETTERS

Tilesetters are responsible for applying granite, ceramic, porcelain, glass or marble tiles to floors, walls, countertops, showers and other surfaces. These skilled laborers possess an eye for detail and strong math skills, which allows them to master the more complex aspects of installation, such as making intricate cuts for a decorative layout.
