  8. Course should now be listed on the left side under **Requested Courses**.
  9. Repeat steps 4-7 until all courses have been selected for student; repeat steps 2-7 for each student.
- To change a class, click on the course name under Requested Courses, select course to drop and click **Drop this Request**.
  - *Recommended* (but not required): please select **Alternate Courses**; follow steps 4-7 and select 'Request Alternate Course' in step 7 for alternate course option.
