Answers to some of the most frequently asked questions about the Workplace Clinic.



FAQ

Where is the Workplace Clinic located?

The Workplace Clinic is located on the campus of the Greenfield High School (4850 S. 60th Street), adjacent to the Fitness Center. Parking and entrance will be on the south side of the High School (Natatorium entrance; Door 11)

What are the clinic hours?

The clinic is open 20 hours per week, but will be closed on all holidays.

Tuesday: 7:30 AM - 2:00 PM

Wednesday: 8:30 AM - 5:00 PM

Friday: 6:30 AM – 1:00 PM

How do I schedule an appointment?

Call 414-777-3463 to make an appointment.

Does the clinic take walk-ins?

Walk-in and same-day appointments are also available and will be taken as time allows.

Do I need to bring any form of ID to the clinic?

Please bring your District school ID or insurance card plus photo ID for identification.

Can the Workplace Clinic prescribe medications?

Yes, medications may be prescribed by the provider based on medical necessity and can be filled by your preferred pharmacy. Select medications may be prescribed and dispensed on-site for no charge.

What lab testing can be done at the clinic?

- Blood Glucose
- Lipid panel (cholesterol, triglycerides)
- Mononucleosis
- Pregnancy Test
- Strep throat test
- Urinalysis

What if I am injured at work?

You can use the clinic for treatment of minor work injuries.

Who can use the clinic?

All School District employees and subscribers (spouses & dependents ages two and up) to the District's health insurance plan are eligible to use the clinic.

Is there a cost to use the clinic?

Eligible individuals have access to all services offered by the Workplace Clinic at no cost.

What kinds of services will be offered?

- Diagnosis and treatment of non-emergent minor illnesses and injuries including but not limited to sore throats, ear aches, sinus infections, flu or cold symptoms, skin rashes, urinary tract infections, sprains/strains and pink eye.
- Wellness services such as select youth and adult physical exams, blood pressure checks, coordination of chronic disease management with your primary care provider and health coaching for lifestyle-related concerns.

Who will operate and staff the clinic?

The clinic will be operated and staffed by Froedtert & the Medical College of Wisconsin Workforce Health with a licensed, board-certified Advanced Practice Provider and a Medical Assistant.
